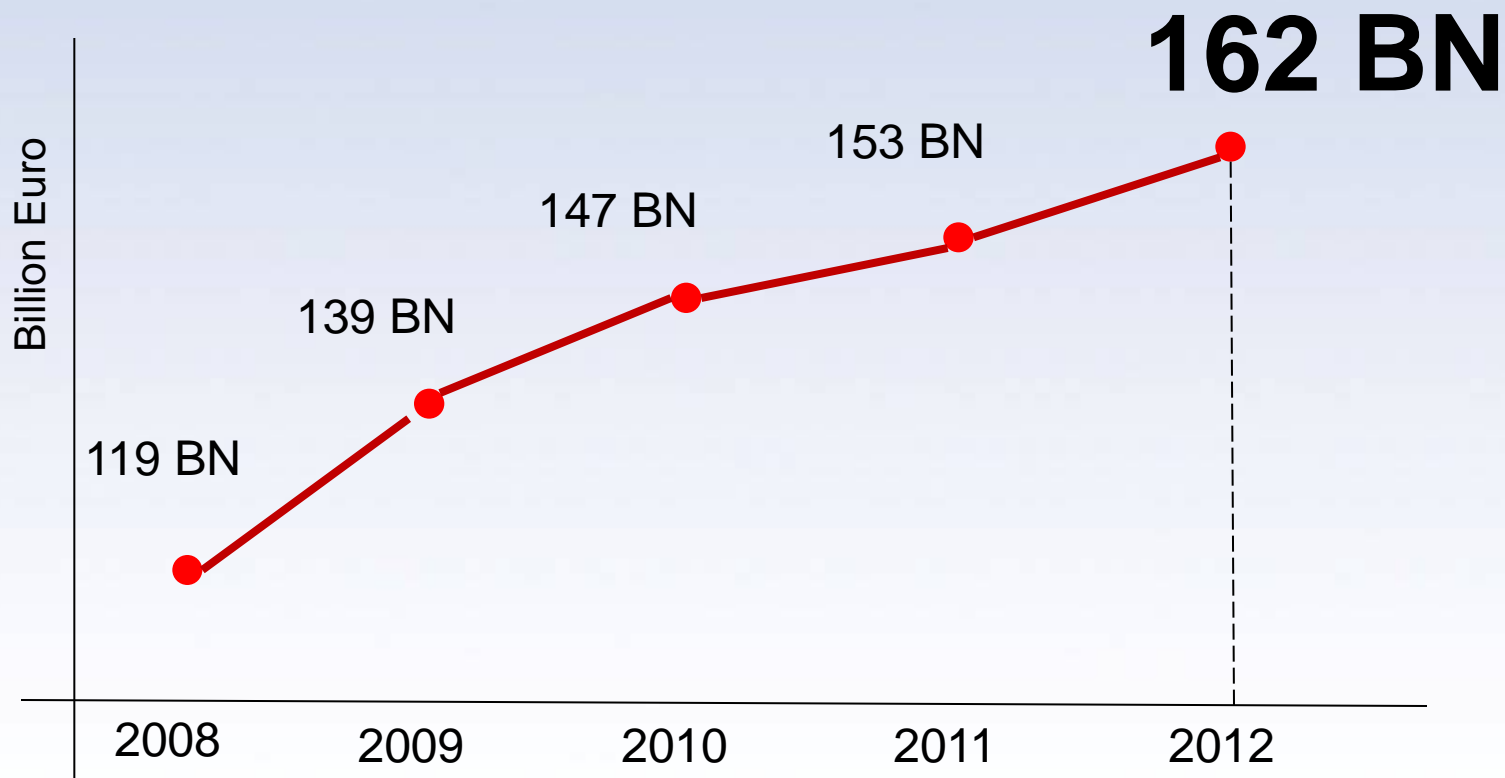

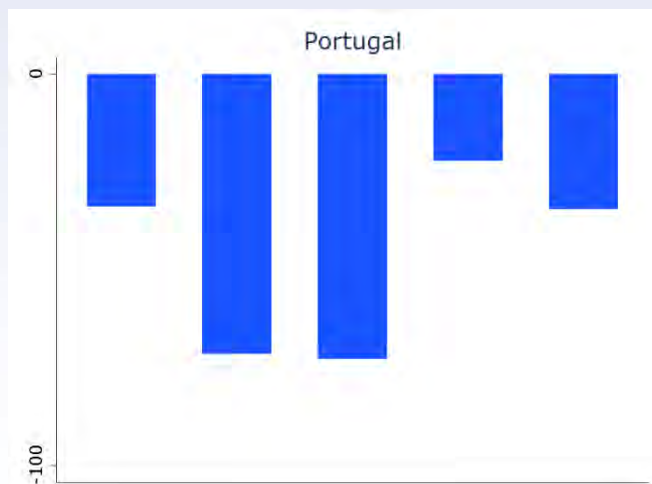
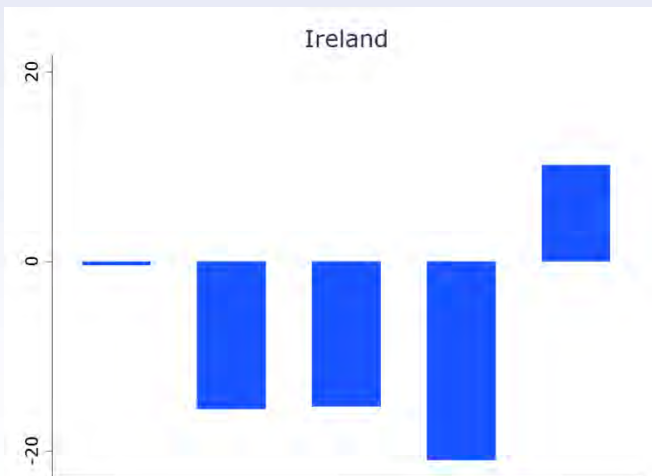
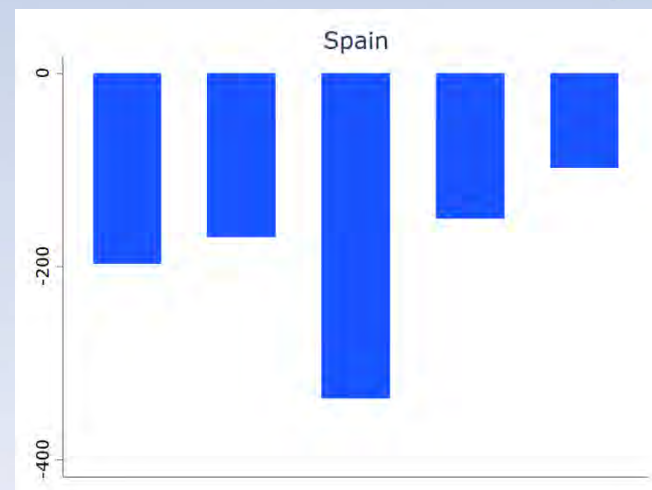
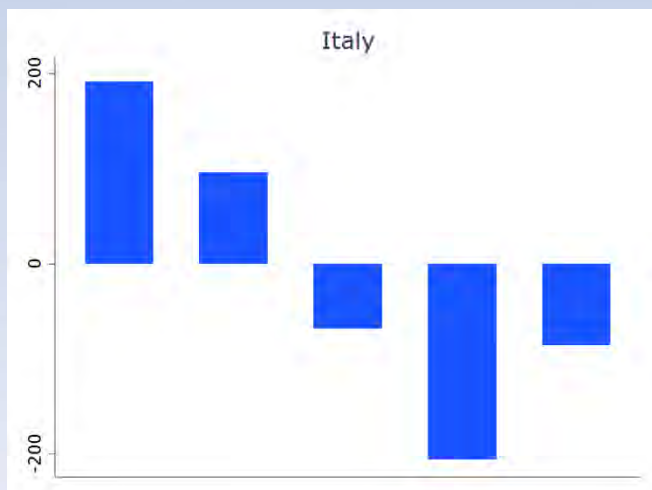
Employment change by wage quintile

2008 - 2010



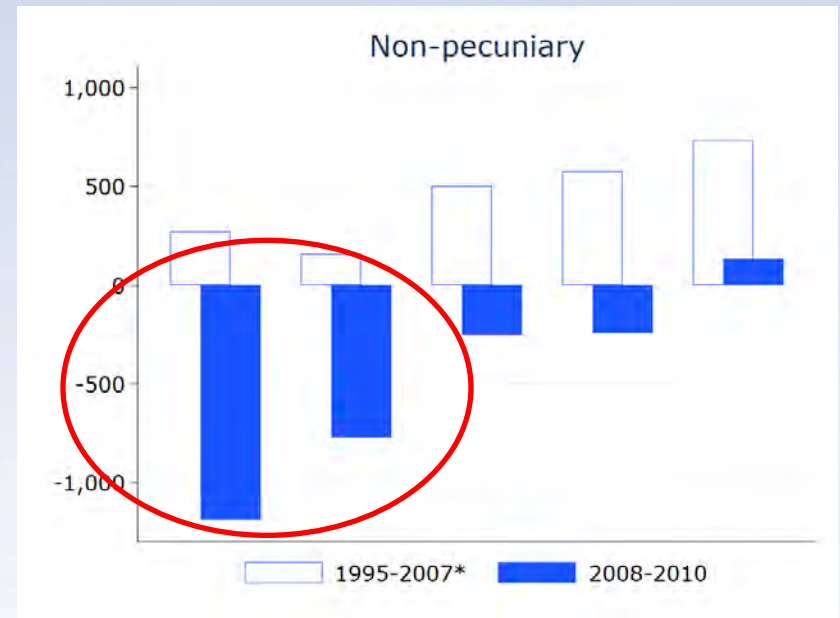
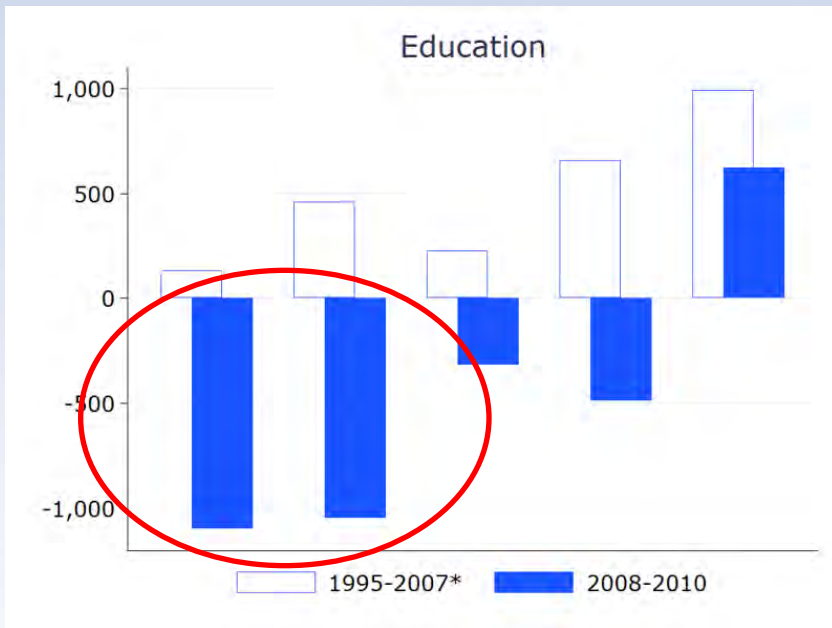


Recent employment shifts by wage quintile 2011q2-12q2

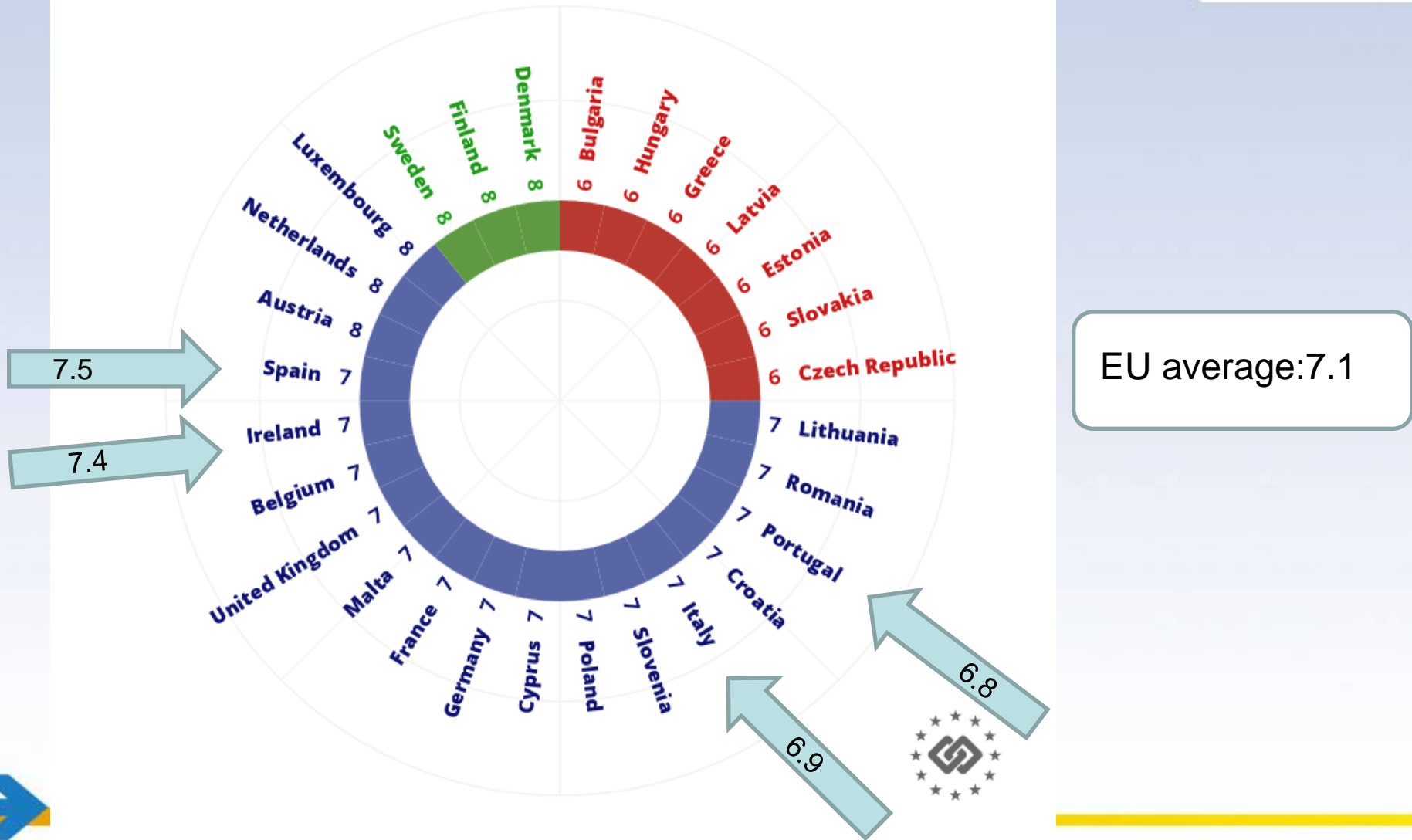

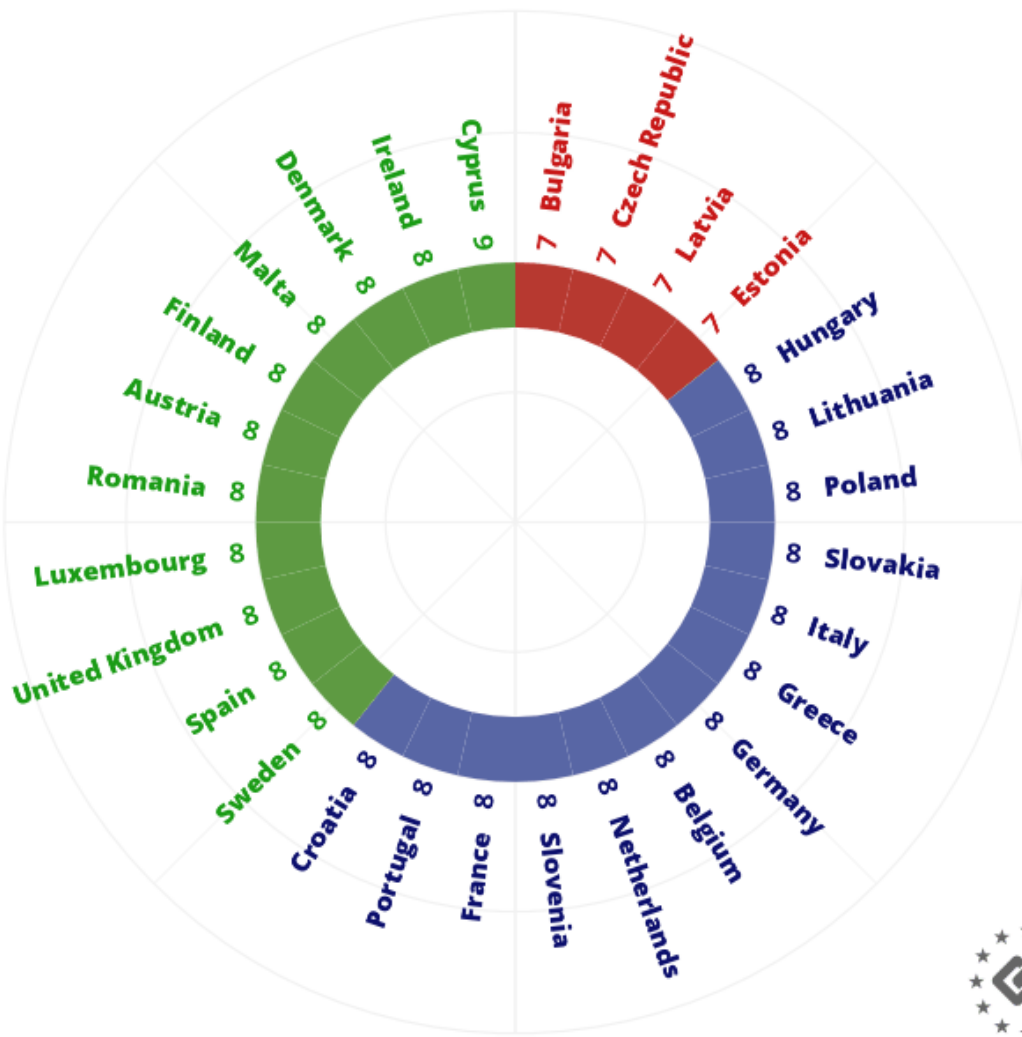

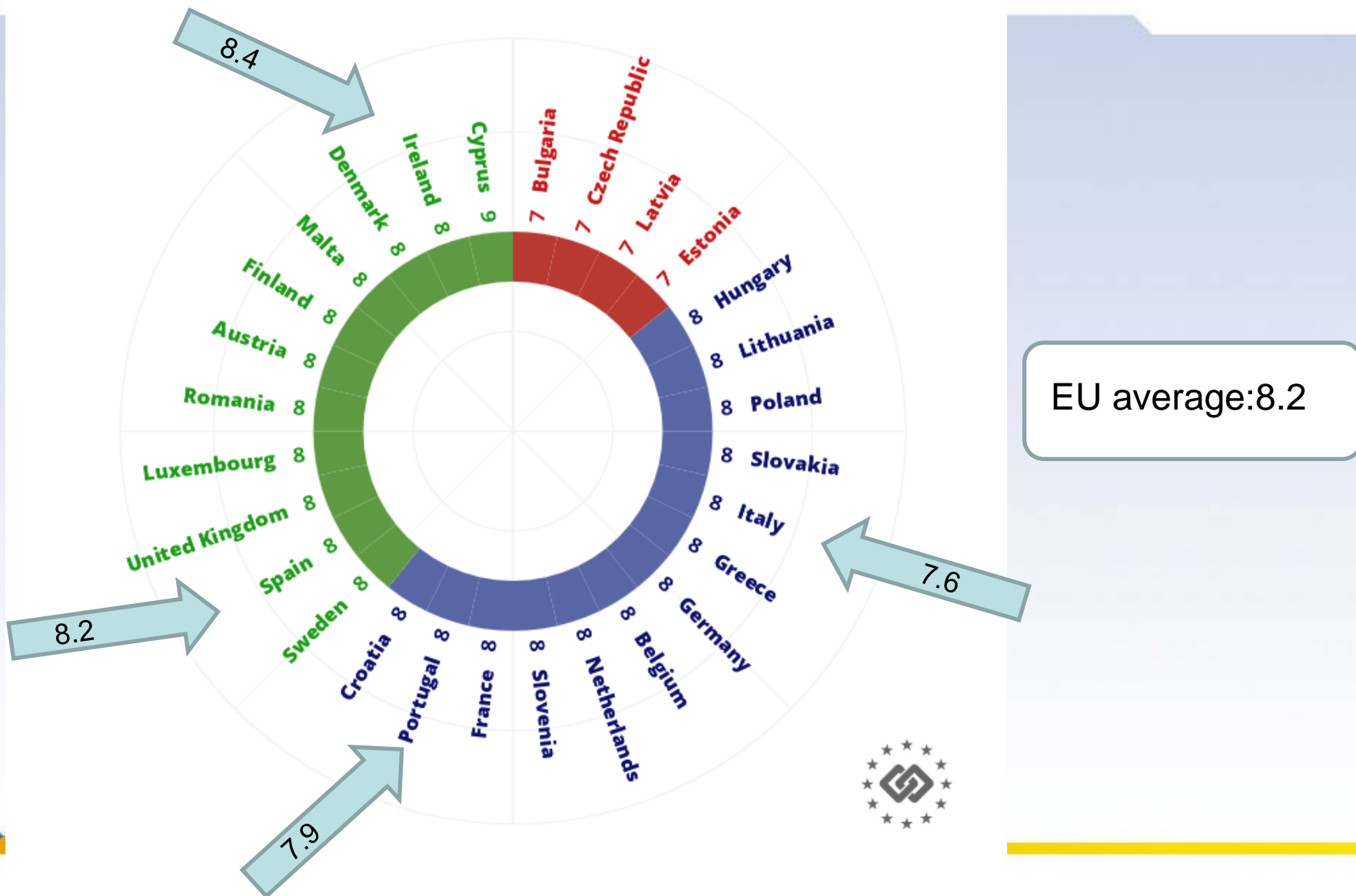
